CAMPUS MISSION AFRICA SUMMIT 2022 IN ZAMBIA

Student Led Movement in partnership with Acts 6000 project hosted the Campus Mission Africa Summit 2022 in Lusaka, Zambia between 12 to 16 December 2022.

As the Eswatini SLM leader, I attended the conference which was attended by 54 leaders from 21 different countries. The keynote speakers included; SLM Global Vice President Holly (USA), Tom (USA), Dr Farai Katsande (Zimbabwe), Dr Muda Yusuf (Nigeria) and David (Korea).

Background

The A6 Project is an initiative that seeks to reach at least 6,000 campuses around the world that have not yet been reached with the gospel. The project was started in Korea, and is now active all around the world helping SLM in multiplying disciples. The A6 project team visit a specific country and help in multiplying disciples.

Training

The building of spiritual movements was emphasized in the training. It was highlighted that the ministry was not just about fellowship but the building of spiritual movements that will be evident in the multiplication of disciples. We were also encouraged to do MD (multiplying disciples) trainings in our countries and to send missionaries (staff and students) in other countries to help in implementing Acts 6,000.

Benefits

After the training, we were given the course materials in flesh drives, and as books. The participation in the training means I am also a qualified trainer of MD now. It was also exciting for us as the Eswatini ministry to connect and network with other SLMs from the different countries.

Implementation

The A6 Project will greatly improve our progress in multiplying disciples as Eswatini SLM. The SLM team (staff and volunteers) is already doing MD training as of January 2023. The desire is to see more students move from engaged to multiplying disciples.

MINISTRY AT ROYAL SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY PARK

Student Led Movements staff Hlengiwe Khumalo visited the Royal Science & Technology Park (RSTP), on 25th November 2022 to help set up a spiritual movement there.

She taught them about the importance of evangelism, and discipleship using mainly the Four Spiritual Laws booklet.

Visiting RSTP has helped Hlengiwe meet notable two young Christian ladies who were delighted in learning and committed to using their time in the campus to share the gospel also after the visit. The two ladies are Luthando Fakudze and Nothando Dlamini.

Luthando volunteered to demonstrate how to use The Four Spiritual Laws while Hlengiwe was teaching and later approached her saying;

"I'm grateful you came, I am born again, but was somehow feeling like I am losing it because I am surrounded by mostly non Christians."

She has since become one of Hlengiwe's disciples currently doing the acceptance booklet on Saturdays at 7pm.

Another disciple Hlengiwe met is Nothando Dlamini, an intern at the institution who professed that as a Christian she was not aware of the importance of sharing the gospel, but wanted to start sharing. Hlengiwe follows her on Mondays.

Hlengiwe had been provided the opportunity to share at the institution with the help of Hlobisile Nhleko who also expressed her interest in being assisted into becoming an active Christian.

DISCIPLESHIP AT EMCU & THE COLLEGE READY SERIES

Every Tuesday, SLM visit EMCU to facilitate in the Morning Dew sessions where discipleship is done to students.

Morning Dew is a compulsory fellowship time for all students at the institution and SLM has been working closely with the institution by assisting with discipleship and evangelising materials.

Some of the materials include the Study with Success, College Ready, The Four Spiritual Law booklet, Jesus Film videos and others. In all the sessions, time is allocated for discussions.

Some students have also been interested in discipleship like Lungile Matse, a 1st year student pursuing Medical Laboratory who has been faithful, available and teachable saying...

"Thank you so much for these sessions, I am definitely learning a lot, and growing in the Lord, so would love to also share the gospel in my community."

Another lady approached the SLM rep after another session that focused on teaching about sexual purity and confessed to be fornicating, asking that she be helped as she is a Christian.

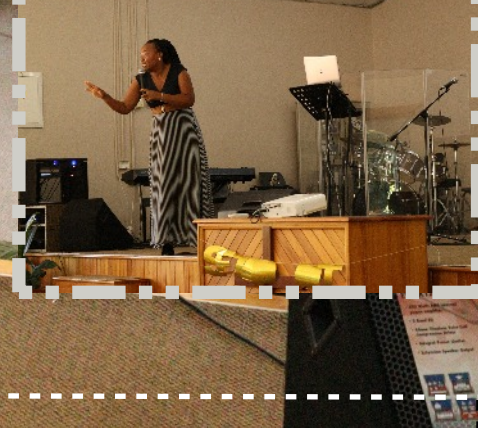

Thandie's Story

During the holidays Thandi visited her grandmother in Lesotho. While she was there she met a young lady named Mtswaki.

"I shared the gospel using my personal testimony on how I struggled to get scholarship at University, a period that drew me closer to God and eventually led me to give my life to Jesus." - Thandi explained.

Mtswaki was touched by the testimony as she got aware that God has been providing for her even though she was not consciously acknowledging Him for that. She gave her life to Christ.

After the holidays, Thandi returned to Eswatini and continues to do a follow-up on her through Whatsapp.

Ashia's Story

Prayer Care Share is a dynamic tool that helps to create a natural relationship with someone, by asking a question 'how can I pray with you', praying with person, and taking additional steps to help the person where you can before you can share Christ.

Ashia Maphosa joined the MC2 Training as a student at Eswatini Christian Medical Univeristy, and used Prayer-Care-Share to reach to another student named Amanda.

"I had known Amanda from school but we were not close, I happened to call her during the training, where she disclosed that her friends had abandoned her, and she felt lonely. I asked her "How can I pray with you?" and we became close" - said Ashia

Amanda has since joined Ashia's small group where they do bible studies, discipleship and sleep overs.

Luvuyo's Story

Luvuyo Dube also started to use prayer-care-share in his church after attending the MC2 training.

"I have resolved to use the Prayer-Care-Share strategy in our youth meetings at church. This tool has helped us to easily hear from each other, how are we, how can we pray with each other which has created a beautiful closeness among us and it is a blessing to see the unity across." He said

In one instance, a young boy called Andiswa shared that he was being bullied at school, and with the seriousness of the matter, Luvuyo with his church notified the lad's grandmother and they resolved to change the school. None of these would have surfaced had Prayer-Care-Share not been used.

MAPPING FOR CHURCH PLANTING

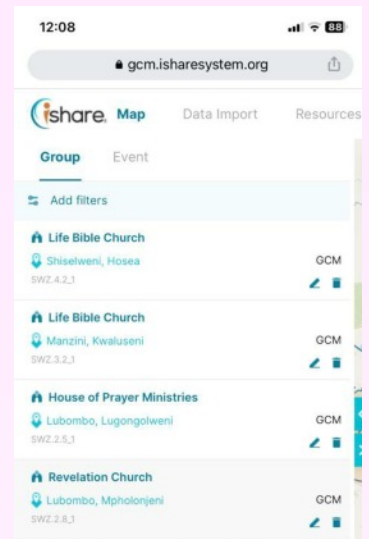
GCM seeks to see a vital church for every 1000 people, so GCM is currently doing mapping to help in effective church planting.

The mapping will help to identify the gaps where there is a need for church planting and to identify also the places where churches are congested.

“The process will help the body of Christ in Eswatini to reach out to remote areas where there is a need for a church, and will help GCM to have new partnerships with new churches.” said GCM leader, Sibusiso Mlambo

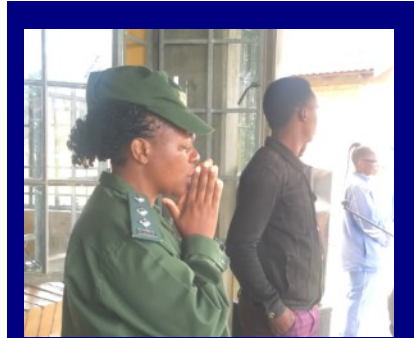
After receiving the certificates, the participants were asked to submit their plans on hosting their own workshops from the institutions or communities they came from.

Women’s Ministry Visit Mawelawela Prison

Women’s Ministry visited the Mawelawela Women’s Corrections Centre on 26th December 2022 for vision casting.

The travelling team included; Rev. Samson Nzima (CCC Eswatini NTL), Mrs Ncamsile Nzima (Women’s Ministry Leader), and volunteers Pastor Sibongile Dlamini and Nomsa Dlamini. The Women’s ministry also partnered with other organizations in raising the Christmas gifts, whose members also visited the corrections centre.

SUCCESS AT SCHOOL FOLLOW UP AT LIMKOKWING UNIVERSITY

Limkokwing University of Creative Technology Eswatini has adopted the Study With Success program to be part of their first year students orientation starting from this year 2023.

On the 21st January, 450 of the first year students enrolled in the program, with another group scheduled to enrol on the 11th February 2023.

The training is a follow up from the Success At School Training of Trainers workshop that was hosted by Women Ministry in November 2022. LUCT had sent three lecturers; Philile Khumalo, Zwelakhe Mawelela and Khetsiwe Mabuza as representatives for the institution.

Speaking after the training; Mrs Stella Shongwe (position) expressed the institutions excitement for the partnership as it is aligning with the institution's goal of producing industry ready graduates.

"The program came at a very convenient time for the institution, aftermath what COVID 19 did. We feel this will become a very important instrument for our students to engage, and improve, and achieve their objects." She said.
