ESWATINI MINISTRY UPGRADE TO STAGE 2 COUNTRIES

Campus Crusade for Christ is globally aiming for the sustainability of all its national ministries.

This is to reach to a point whereby all the national ministries have enough fund capacity, effectively use the organization's systems and have flourishing ministry results.

As of 2023, Eswatini has upgraded to a Stage 2 country due to the improvements in different areas of the ministry. All national ministries are

expected to subscribe to the 5 non-negotiables which include; having official emails, using Google Suite, using Netsuite, Leading with Information, and Attaining sustainability

- Official Email Addresses: Eswatini has been able to assign official email addresses to all its staff as of May 2023.
- 2. Using Google Suite: The ministry has been actively working digitally lately by sharing e-docs.

- 3. Netsuite: Eswatini has also improved in the usage of Nesuite from previous years.
- 4. Leading With Information: Lack of accurate and timely reports dwarfs the progress of any ministry. Eswatini has created a culture of monthly reports.
- 5. Sustainability: A
 Sustainability office was set
 up, and there are trainings,
 and staff sensitisation on
 Sustainability.

ESWATINI NOW COACHING OTHER COUNTRIES

With the improvements that are taking place in different areas of the ministry, Eswatini's Sibusiso Mlambo has been chosen to coach in some clusters in the Operations and in Global Church Movements.

With Operations, Eswatini was chosen to lead Cluster F which consist of 6 countries (Eswatini, Mauritius, Lesotho, Botswana, Namibia, and South

Africa). The coaching is about helping the other countries to also improve where Eswatini has improved.

With Global Church Movements, Eswatini also leads Cluster F.

This is a huge feat for the local ministry because it also provide a networking and growth opportunity.

GLOBAL SUSTAINABILITY VISIT ESWATINI

Eswatini had the privilege to receive close up coaching sessions from Jacob and Idah Banda who are from Global Sustainability team.

The Banda family spent three full days in the kingdom that they dedicated to help coach the NTLs, leadership team, and staff.

On the first day, they met with the National Team Leaders, Rev. Samson and Mrs. Ncamsile Nzima. On the second day, they met the leadership team training them on sustainability and support raising.

All this happened between 9 and 11 May 2023 at Mountain View and the Campus

for Christ offices respectively.

There will be a detailed DMPD training for news staff later this year which will be more detailed as eight new staff members already did MPD training

OPERATIONS' TEAM TRAINING

Eswatini is committed to excellence and continuous improvements as it grows with new staff, new opportunities, new ideas and new technologies.

The operations department which plays a major role in capacity building is also improving gradually and intentionally.

Mzwandile Kunene and Hlengiwe Khumalo who are serving in the finance department had both physically attended Netsuite trainings in Rwanda and Ethiopia respectively. There has also been numerous and continuous online OpsFC training that the operations team makes sure they attend weekly.

Vusa Sithole has also been attending Global Technology Support Network (GTSN) meetings as a trainee IT person for the local ministry weekly.

There have seen substantial improvements with these developments exposing and equipping the staff to global coaches, which then makes running with the vision more lighter.

All 18 CCC staff were present in the orientation, and are all expected to adopt the digital way of doing things.

"We were really excited with the progress and cooperation we received from everyone, we look forward to working conveniently with our systems now." Thanked Mzwandile.





PREPARING FOR MULTIPLYING DISCIPLES PROJECT

As a follow up to the A6 Project training that was held in Zambia, in December 2022, CCC Korea is sending some of its missionaries to assist Eswatini in multiplying disciples.

The Korean team will be in Eswatini from July 10 to August 12 2023, and will be working closely with the SLM team.

Currently, the SLM team alongside the Korean team are preparing for the project through Zoom meetings and online engagements.

"The objective of the project is to help move engaged disciples into multiplying disciples in Eswatini, and to train the local staff into having sustainable movements in the different campuses, and to improve

engagements in small group meetings." emphasized Luvuyo Dube, one of the SLM staff.

The project is in line with the SLM goal for this year which is to raise 200 multiplying disciples.

TAEKWONDO IN ACTION FOLLOW UP





Follow-Up is the process by which new believers are established and equipped with the basics of Christianity, so they grow towards spiritual maturity and become multiplying disciples.

Our main goal for this year is moving engaged disciples to multiplying disciples through effective follow up and trainings, therefore building spiritual movements everywhere so that everyone knows someone who truly follows Jesus Christ.

On the 9th and 11th of May 2023, TIA (Taekwondo in Action) students of about 10 were trained on how to do follow up, an ongoing discipleship following the previous encounter with them where they were trained to share the Gospel.

Follow-Up is important as it helps new believers establish their confidence in the bible as the basis of their faith, help them understand biblical principles of spiritual growth, build a friendship with them

and also introduce them to God's desire that all Christians witness.

Having completed the basic follow up series with the students, it is heartwarming to hear their testimonies especially as they share what they learnt through out the sessions and the interest and zeal to continue to share the Gospel and do follow-Up

SLM HOST ALL NIGHT PRAYER

One of the most exciting scenes in today's age is seeing young people wholeheartedly devote themselves to prayer. In times when moral decay is at worst stage it is always impressive to see interdenominational students gather to pray and to also commit themselves to share the gospel.

On May 12th SLM hosted an all night prayer at the Campus Crusade premises in Mbabane which was themed "Commissioned to Pray"

SLM is on the mission to reach young people today to change tomorrow's future leaders. Just as Proverbs 29:16 states; "When the wicked are in authority, transgression increases, but the [uncompromisingly] righteous shall see the fall of the wicked."

Investing in young people especially with the gospel therefore creates a sustainable plinth for effective and responsible future leaders.

Around 80 attended the all night prayer, which was also graced by National Team Leader (Director) Rev. Samson Nzima, Mr. Adeloforan Amu, and Rachel Timilola from Eswatini Medical Christian University as main speakers.

The National Director of CCC Eswatini, encouraged young people to submit under the authority of God once they are called because it is also very important to hear and be sure of the voice of God once called. He later prayed for them.

GCM have assigned the month of May for a church planting campaign that happens every year worldwide, even this year Eswaini dedicated the month to the initiative in a theme called "I WILL BUILD MY CHURCH"

The campaign encourages the Christian community to be active in evangelism, discipleship, and church multiplication.

Prayer

GOD'S SYNERGIES-CHURCH PLANTING

"For we are God's fellow workers. You are God's field, God's building." - 1 Corinthians 3:9

Partnership is God's is deal for His kingdom to multiply, that is why Paul refers the church as God's fellow workers, while others plant, others cultivates and God brings the growth. Jesus even said the harvest is plentiful but the only thing that is in short are laborers, the few laborers should ask more from God. As GCM strategy we know our part is not only praying but to also identify the laborer and approach them to work along them.

Observing Eswatini, everyone is having an opinion that the country has been overly evangelized and the strict standards in communities makes church planting slow and even hard. The team found it effective to focus more on partnering and coaching church planters to do the job in their communities rather than interfering.

In this month of church planting, it was pleasing to see a church being planted in the center of a village at Matsetsa on the Eastern of the country. Amid unfriendly weather and horrible roads in that place, multiplication is taking place. The church was planted in March this year by Mgcashini Lukhele who had already met with Mandla and shared the vision of his calling to start a church.

"Since our plan action is to share our vision and strategies of evangelism, discipleship and church multiplication, I happen to know Mgcashini in our area and I shared with him our vision. He grew interest and introduce me to his pastor; the pastor was also excited so I invited Macashini to our online MC2 training. He already had a place to start so he did open air and house to house evangelism. Then the church started to grow with 8 won to Christ. Soon he started training the 8 with four spiritual laws and they came back with seven who gave their lives to Christ." Mandla Maziya highlighted.

3 CHURCHES & 16 SMALL GROUPS PLANTED

At least 3 churches and 16 small groups have been planted aligning with the campaign. Two churches were planted in Siteki and 1 was planted in Lavumisa.

"Last year in December I met with Mr Mamba and I share about church planting. He was very interested and he shared that he wanted to start a church and so I told him about an area called Mabovini where there are very few churches". shared Mandla Maziya a GCM staff. He also mentioned that Mr Mamba went to Mabovini and started a church in January 2023 after doing home to home evangelism where he won people to Christ. Then on the 26th of March Mandla went again to visit the church and

found that 15 people were attending.

Matsetsa
Revival Life Ministry finally
planted another church. After
showing interest to Mandla
Maziya of planting another
church, they did an open air in
Matsatse at the Lubombo
region where they won 10
people to Christ.

Then Mandla went there to train them on the 4 spiritual laws so that they start sharing around their area. Mgcashini Lukhele, the Life Revival Ministry chairperson is leading this church and has attended the current online MC2 training. "We trust God that he will learn a lot especially on how to disciple new believers". Said Mandla Maziya.

Lavumisa

At Siphambanweni in Lavumisa, another church was planted in the month of April by Pastor Lushaba. He had the desire to start a church, attended the M2 in April and in this area he started a small group with 15 people, some won to Christ.

In as much as the campaign was scheduled for the month of May, the dedication to evangelism, discipleship and church planting should continue. The impact it has made in the Eswatini nation cannot be unwritten.

FOLLOW UP PROGRESS

Campus Crusade for Christ does not only delight in evangelism, but it is committed to winning, building, and sending Christ multiplying disciples.

GCM uses a Level 1 to Level 5 grading method to help track the progress of the disciples they make after sharing the gospel.

Level 1 are seed sowers, who are believers that start sharing the gospel themselves, using the available tools. Level 2 are church planters and small group leaders, the believers

who not only share the gospel, but also do a follow up to those they have shared the gospel to. Level 3 are church multipliers which are believers that have multiplying disciples.

Level 4 are movement trainers which are believers that can now train others on how to build movements by coaching seed sowers.

Level 5 are movement catalysts which are believers that are believers who are supervising multiple movements even across countries just as Apostle Paul was overseeing different churches in the early church.

This year, 2023, GCM has compiled a report of its progress with the believers it has engaged grading where they are according to the levels and the results were as follows:

Level 1: 25 Level 2: 17 Level 3: 4 Level 4: 1 Level 5: 1

OVER 20 GCM VISION CASTINGS

In this year's GCM strategy, the plan is to have at least 50 vision castings by Decmeber 2023. So, since January the team has been actively involved doing vision castings around the country with churches, communities and believers.

So far, GCM have done over 20 vision castings. They have resulted in having more trainings, planted churches and small groups. Even with the simplest acts of sharing the vision, God is able to open doors and create movements.

Mnotfo Nkhambule a GCM staff, visited Mahlabatsini, on the 8th April, to share and challenge on the GCM vision. He shared to about 70 believers where there were two churches who came to worship together during the Passover services.

On the 9th of April he went to Siweni at Jesus Christ Fellowship Church where he shared to more than 20 believers.

On the 20th May GCM had a training at Mtimane African Evangelical church in Mankayane located in the Manzini region. This training was a result of a vision casting that happened in March.

Theere was a warm welcome from the church, and 21 participants were trained which included the leadership and believers. Since it was the first week, the training was scheduled to continue in the first week of June so that they are also commissioned into the field.

Women Ministry as a strategy under GCM has been hoping to recruit a team of volunteers from the MC2 attendees that was held in February 2023, and other faithful disciples.

God made it possible for the strategy to recruit at least 15 key volunteers who have since formed part of the Women's Ministry team.

Women Ministry has been actively involved in the ministry especially with the Success At School TOT that was held in November 2022, and the follow up seminars.

Speaking about the new volunteers, Women Ministry

leader Mrs. Ncamsile Nzima expressed her gratitude by saying;

"We thank God for the wonderful progress we are seeing, having a Women Ministry team was something I have been praying for because we are under staffed as GCM. We are believing God for more impact as we will reach new heights now."

Early this year, Pastor Lucy Dlamini heard met with Women Ministry and a relationship was built whereby she asked that the ministry visit Mnyokane for MC2 training as they had a group of interdenominational brethren that are wholeheartedly devoted in doing things of God, interceding, and having community prayers.

Women Ministry honoured the invitation and on 26th April 2023. The first phase of a live MC2 training was held being facilitated by GCM leader with

Sibusiso Mlambo, and Mandla Maziya, while national ministry directors Rev. Samson Nzima and Mrs. Ncamsile Nzima attended.

Atleast 24 people attended the training, which will also continue later in June 2023.









JESUS FILM SHOW AT MAFUTSENI

On 5th May 2023, Women Ministry alongside Jesus Film visited Mafutseni to have a Jesus Film show.

The film was shown in a tent that was erected by the newly formed church by MC2 participant Mrs Thembi Mdluli. At first, they did home visitations, sharing the gospel one on one using the four spiritual laws.

While doing the one on one

the prayer to received Christ. Around 130 people attended the screening of the Jesus Film. This included men, women, and children. At least 25 of them prayed the prayer to receive Christ.

CCC Eswatini National Team Leader Samson Nzima, women ministry leader, Ncamsile Nzima, JF volunteer Mphumelelo Xaba, and CCC Eswatini accountant Mzwandile Nkambule were part of the team that facilitated the showing of the Jesus Film.

On Sunday 7th May 2023, the new believers received Bibles from CCC Eswatini for discipleship and follow ups.

"What God is doing is just amazing, when you look at the fact that 85 people received Christ, young and old, it is just amazing." Concluded Mrs Ncamsile Nzima.



2 CHURCHES & 14 SMALL GROUPS ESTABLISHED

Two churches have been planted so far under the guidance of Women Ministry while a total of 19 small groups has been established from January to June 2023.

Mrs. Thembi Mdluli who was a participant in the February MC2 training, was able by God's grace to plant a church in Mafutseni. She began doing home visitationfor one on one evangelism using the four spiritual laws.

On 5th May 2023, a Jesus film show was done, and on Sunday of the same week, Bibles were distributed.

At least around 80 people have joined in the new church.

Mcebo Mabuza is another MC2 participant who was delighted to have the ministry support her in church planting. The church started with home evangelism where 2 small groups were formed which were later merged to form the new church.

At least 14 small groups were formed from through Women Ministry this year so far. 12 were formed through MC2 and 2 were a result of the SAS seminars.

. MBULUZI HIGH SCHOOL RECEIVE SUCCESS AT SCHOOL

The Success at School strategy has been effectively used by Eswatini this year to penetrate to different institutions and places and to start movements.

On May 4th, there was another seminar at Mbuluzi High School, which was a follow up seminar from the Success At School Training of Trainers workshop that commenced in November 2022.

The school dedicated this day for the seminar and included every learner from Form 1 to Form 5. A team of facilitators from the ministry was there to assist this woman ministry initiative.

Some of the topics that were covered include; Setting Goals, Setting Priorities, Exam Preparation, How to Study, Memory Strategies, Taking Notes, Daily Perfromance Curve, Your Sleeping Needs, and Keeping Yourself Sharp.

The number of learners that attended the seminar was around 450. A total of 73 learners prayed the prayer to receive Christ.

Speaking after the seminar some of the learners expressed their gratitude for the opportunity saying that they have been greatly empowered and they had vowed to commit themselves to academic excellence by following the tips Success At School had empowered them with.

Zwelakhe Langa who is doing Form 5 was one of the learners that accepted Christ in the day. He expressed how gracious he felt God was to him to pursue him just when his life was starting to take a wrong turn.

"I was already starting to involve myself with wrong friends and to waste my life but I am glad I met God today." He said.



















· LEADERSHIP FORUM & VISION CASTING

Leader Impact Eswatini successfully hosted a Leadership Forum & Vision Casting event at Mountain View on April 22, 2023.

At least 22 professionals registered for the forum, which was graced by Dr. Powlose, missionary doctor based at RFM Hospital as the main speaker.

Dr Paulos encouraged everyone on the importance of representing Christ in every space God puts you in. He emphasized that everyone is only blessed to bless others, therefore it is a privilege to share Christ in the workplace.
