Technology & Systems Adoption

When the Global Ops team led by Jon Velcott visited Eswatini early this year, they encouraged the national ministry to improve in the adoption of technology and systems. They helped expose the importance of Operations in the structure of the organization. They also highlighted the expectations that needed to be met by national ministries as they were touring throughout Africa.

The local ministry is in the process of improving the operations especially in regards to technology and systems adoption. This include first the use of Cru official applications like Nesuite, Google Suite, MPDX, Power BI, and Okta.

Some of the improvements in the process include having technology trainings with Vusa who is the local technology contact person. The local ministry availed him for a training as an okta administrator and another as a privacy manager.

Since the local ministry does not have a fully functional website, Vusa alongside Luvuyo and Thando were trained to become Adobe Experience Manager to help set up and manage the website. The website is still under development.

One of the major achievements in regard to technology and systems adoption is the continuous orientation and support of local staff on the usage of the systems. The local ministry designated at least 1 hour every week to train the staff on the systems, to check individual's progress, and to assist those that have challenges. This approach has been more effective



because everyone is closely assisted in real time which also help to identify the challenges the staff have as they use the systems.

The "small steps" approach has helped to give a good foundational explanation of what the systems are and why they have to be used among all the staff. Currently, all the staff are enrolled in Okta, and have greatly improved in using Google Suite. There is now a shared drive which help to minimize working offline, and maximize cooperative work in same documents.

There has also been a great improvement in the Netsuite literacy among the staff, which then decrease the workload of the finance team. Overall the progress is promising, and we believe that we will achieve a stage where we have fully adopted our systems and technology.

We thank God for what we have achieved so far and we are looking forward for more.

TOT Follow Ups

Whenever the disciples of Jesus Christ went to share the gospel in communities, they would return and bring a feedback to Jesus. This would be an indicator that they had understood the teachings of Jesus and it would show that they were indeed growing and ready to be used by God in fishing men and one day, Jesus coached them and said, "Do not be glad that evil spirits obey you, rather be glad because your names are written in heaven."

Learning from the example of our Lord and Saviour, as Global Church Movements we are also expecting to get feedback from 69 church planters who were trained in February to facilitate MC2. These were participants from the Training of Trainers we had at Thokoza and at Jesus Restores Center in Checkers. They were commissioned not only to be church planters but to be church multipliers.

Our GCM team was assigned to follow up and coach them as they were divided into 3 distinctive teams. The GCM has been doing the follow ups and coaching where they discovered that at least 30% have already organized trainings. The others are honing their skills as seed sowers. We believe that they will also start trainings soon as we continue coaching them.



Kudzeni Outreach

One of our strategic intents as Campus Crusade is to pioneer into missional gaps; it is therefore at the heart of GCM Eswatini to reach to places where it is hard to reach with the gospel. We partnered with God's Love Cares Ministries at Kudzeni where they hosted an evangelism outreach.

Mnotfo Nkambule went to represent the team and he taught the church how to use the four spiritual laws which they then used to go door-to-door sharing the gospel and reached 138 people, where 54 gave their life to Christ. This happened on 9th March 2024, and the church will then proceed to do discipleship to the converts. The church members who went sharing the gospel shall be coached on how to do discipleship so that they proceed to become church planters. Praise the Lord!

Church Planting Campaign

It is in every annual plan for GCM to have a church planting campaign in May, which begins from the beginning of the month to the end. The campaign aims at sensitising believers on the necessity to partake in the Great commission through evangelism, and discipleship.

UNESWA & CCC PARTNERSHIP



Early this year, Women Ministry through the grace of God was able to foster a partnership between UNESWA's Student counselling and Campus Crusade for Christ Eswatini. The partnership made it possible to host a Success At School TOT at Kwaluseni Campus in February 2024.

The students that were selected to be part of the training were peer counsellor educators, from the different UNESWA campuses. After the training, the students were encouraged to organize seminars either among university students, schools, or their local communities.

One of the first student to organize a seminar at his community school was Bandile Mphila. Mphila organized the seminar at Magobodvo High School in Maphalaleni, where other peer counsellor educators joined to help as

facilitators. This included Mzwakhe Mabuza, Aline Iradukunda, and Nosipho Shongwe. They were supported by staff members that included, national director Rev. Samson Nzima, Mrs. Ncamsile Nzima, Mrs. Jabu Tsabedze, Vuyiswa Dlamini and Vusa Sithole.

At least 93 out of 101 students prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour. Its really inspiring to see the devotion that these students have shown through volunteering to facilitate the program and to share the gospel to learners across the country.

The partnership is really bearing good fruits as more PCEs are volunteering in different areas of the ministry. Some have also registered to be part of the Women Initiative training that is scheduled for 07th to 09th May 2024.



The Launch of WOMEN INITIATIVE

Addis Ababa, Ethiopia



Our Women Ministry leader, Mrs. Ncamsile Nzima travelled to Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, for the Women Initiative Conference on 11th to 15th March 2024. The Women Initiative aims to equip 100 Women leaders who will mobilize and raise 100,000 Christ - like disciples by 2025 December.

The vision is to spiritually equip women leaders to know and share Jesus through targeted women's strategies, fostering impactful, and generational change. The mission is to mobilize Christ-centred women leaders through focused initiatives who launch spiritual movements in their generation "

Eswatini is also trusting God to mobilize 1,000 women towards the 100,000 that is aimed. This May, there is an ongoing training on how to use JF Apps which is organized by Eswatini's Women Ministry.



Maphalaleni AEC

Women Ministry is rooted in its vision to see women from different denominations build spiritual movements everywhere so that everyone knows someone who truly follow Jesus Christ.

One of its strategies to achieve this, is to work with different churches, and to build partnerships with other movements that are empowering women and girls. On the 16 of March, the women ministry team was invited to be part of Africa Evangelical Church's Women Conference (Mbuluzi Circuit).

The conference was attended by over 95 women from their respective branches. As the guest speakers, the Women Ministry team equipped the congregation with "The Best Parenting Styles" topic from SAS and the importance of sharing the gospel using a video clip of the Samaritan woman as a reference.



SAS at MDS Primary

A Success at School Seminar was held at Mater Dolorosa Primary School on 16th March 2024. At least 4000 children were trained.

The children presented excited, jovial and grateful faces as the presentations went on. They even sang a song appreciating Campus Crusade for bringing the program to their school.

Grade 5,6 &7 were the classes that got the privilege to be trained with SAS. They are being prepared for their examinations in November.

We thank God for the relationship that MDS has with us as the principal sent 14 of the school's teachers to attend last year's Training of Trainers of the SAS at Campus Crusade.



Gwamile VOCTIM SAS

Gwamile VOCTIM is one of the many local tertiary institutions that have embraced the success at school program. On 26th March 2024, the facilitating team visited the institution and had a short seminar, where the students were trained on the topics that included; Setting Goals, Setting Priorities, The Pareto Principle, and a clip of The Falling Plates.

Over 100 students were trained.



SAS Mobilization

On the 16th of April 2024, the Women Ministry team in collaboration with PCE volunteers attended the 2024 UNESWA's first years intake orientation. The mandate was to mobilize students who would be interested to be trained with Success At School. Mrs. Ncamisile Nzima made a short presentation during the proceedings explaining what success at school was. 26 students registered.

While mobilizing, the team met Pastor Malaza of Christ the Pillar Church, who was thrilled by Success at School and the work that Campus Crusade for Christ is doing. He requested that the team may visit his church to facilitate this program in their youth camp on September 7th.

We thank God for the success in mobilizing for the next SAS seminars. We also appreciate the PCEs that volunteered to help as we mobilized.

On March 19th 2024, Leader Impact national leader travelled to South Africa for a consultation meeting with Garrie Holtzhausen, a Team Leader for Family Life South Africa. This meeting came as a response to the great need for a collaboration between Leader Impact and Family Life. Leader Impact is a strategy that focuses on the holistic development of a leader - personal, professional and spiritual development. There has been a rising agency to collaborate Family Life with Leader Impact, as to play a pivotal role in helping Leaders to address some challenges that affect their personal/ relationships, especially amongst husband and wives, as well as children.

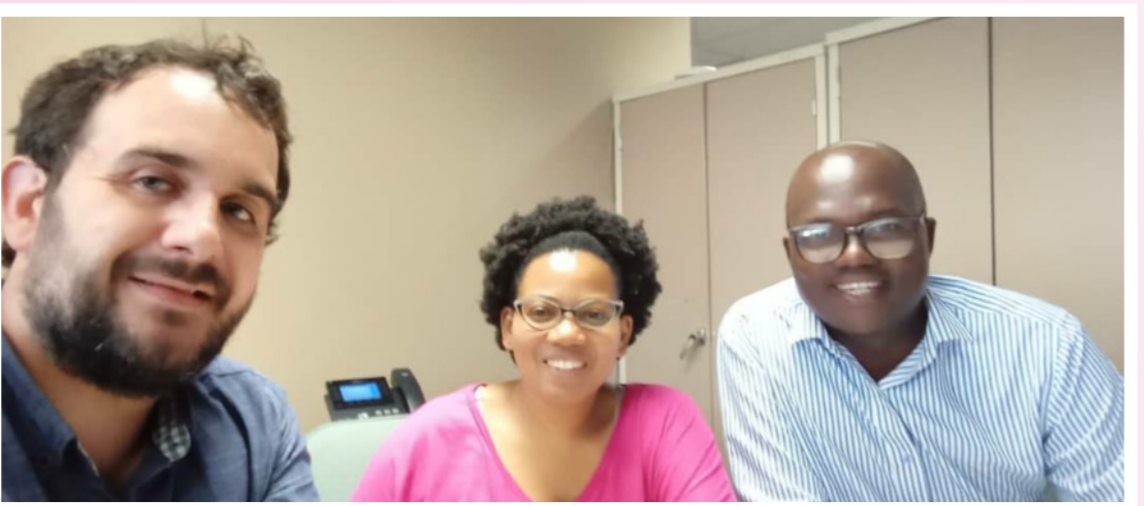
