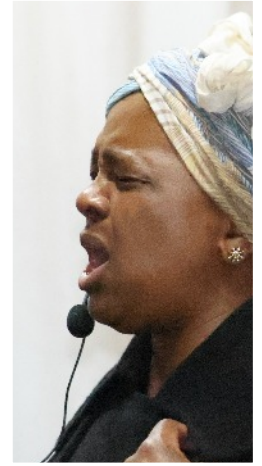

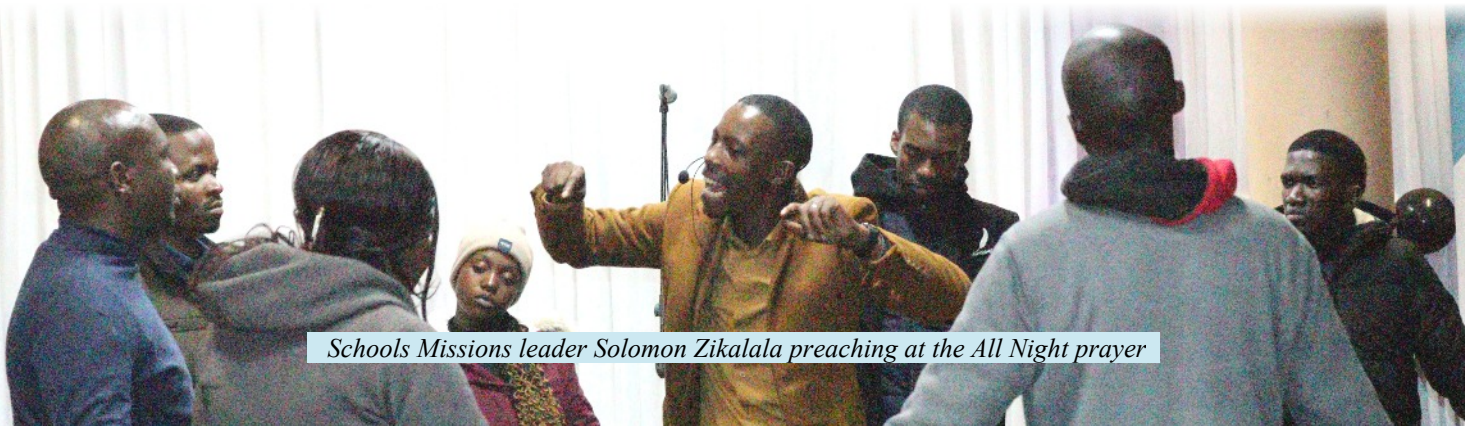

“We started by talking about how they could apply what we had just taught them under the Study with Success program.” Narrated Luvuyo.

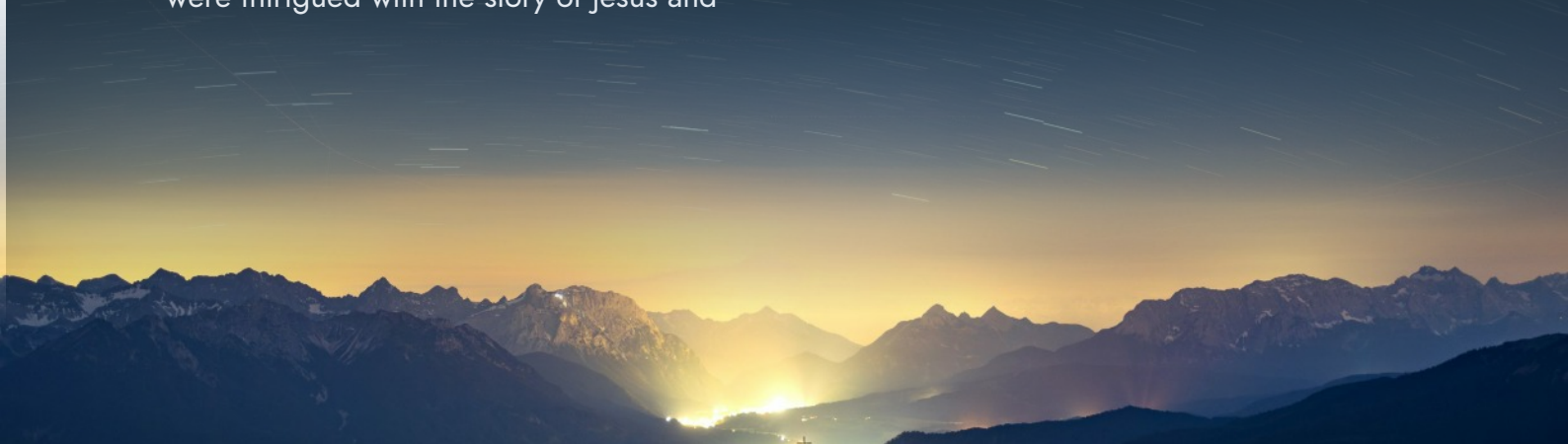
The conversation would lead to them wanting to know more about the Christian faith as they have grown from a Muslim household. They were intrigued with the story of Jesus and

how he was represented which was contrary from where they came from.

“We did not come to a conclusive agreement with them accepting the Lord but, I was just enthralled with the interest the young boy had” Luvuyo added.

Eswatini is predominantly a Christian country but has since witnessed a skyrocketing growth of the Asian descent community which identify as Muslims.

“As we are trying to pioneer into all missional gaps, the growth of other religions locally is something we have to counter. It is with joy to see that the Study with Success strategy helps in that regard.” He concluded.

This proactive approach reflects a significant step towards fostering a culture of evangelism within the church community.

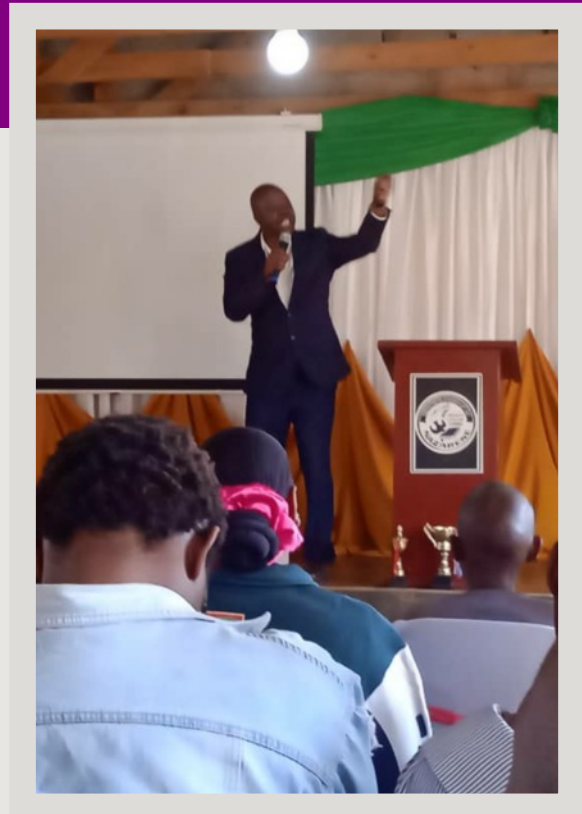
Overall, the training session was a resounding success, equipping the church with practical tools and a renewed passion for spreading the message of Christ.

"We named her Zukiswa, which means "Let God be praised", she is a testament of the undeniable power of God." she shared.

On July 21, Mnotfo returned to Hlobane AEC for a follow-up session as part of Campus Crusade for Christ's GCM initiative. This session marked the second engagement with the church, following an initial training on "The Mission of Jesus" and the "Amazing Question."

"During this latest visit, the congregation shared their experiences with using the Amazing Question in their outreach efforts. Remarkably, 55% of the church members successfully engaged their relational networks with this tool. Notably, some youth reported asking the Amazing Question to their classmates, leading to meaningful conversations where classmates expressed their desires for God's intervention and committed to attending church.

Additionally, members approached individuals struggling with addiction, offering prayer and support after these individuals expressed their wish for God to help them overcome their challenges.

In this session, Mnotfo introduced two new topics: "God-Prepared People" and "Sharing Your Personal Story."

The training focused on identifying individuals of peace—those who are receptive to the gospel message and can facilitate connections with others. The church members learned how to recognize these signs and utilize their relationships to further the Great Commission.

Participants were also encouraged to craft "I will" statements to commit to sharing their personal stories with their networks. This exercise aimed to foster a culture of personal testimony and continued evangelistic outreach.

The session concluded with a commissioning for the church to persist in their efforts, emphasizing the importance of identifying individuals of peace and maintaining their commitment to sharing the Amazing Question and personal stories.

The continued enthusiasm and dedication of Hlobane AEC reflect a growing momentum in their mission efforts. The impact of these trainings is evident in the active and heartfelt responses from the congregation.

SUCCESS AT SCHOOL SEMINARS

As we continue impacting lives across the country, the Women Ministry team sent a group of CCC youth to Christ the Pillar Church in Zion to facilitate a SAS seminar on 7th September 2024.

It was a memorable day for the CTP Church youth as they got equipped for academic excellence in their church's youth camp. The youth had a lot of students from different schools across the country who could not be exposed to the program unless their schools hosted it.

"We can't even express how impactful this seminar was to the youth, and I am definitely anticipating change." Christ the Pillar Church Pastor said.

More than 40 young people from different churches and branches attended the CTP youth camp and the seminar. 21 young people also made the decision to follow Christ as their Lord and Savior.

Women Ministry also had a SAS seminar at Boyane High on 13th September 2024. The team that facilitated there

include the national director Samson Nizma, Make Nomsa Vuyiswa, Mnotfo, and Vusa. The topics that were covered included; *Setting Goals, The Pareto Principle, Defining Priorities, Daily Performance Curve, Exam Preparation, Keeping Yourself Sharp, and Taking Notes.*

The seminar was set to help Form 3s and Form 5s prepare for their final examinations. At least 33 students from the 70 that were taught, made the decision to follow Christ.

WOMEN INITIATIVE PRAYERS

After the Women Initiative was launched, the Women Ministry team fully devoted themselves into the vision. The goal is to raise at least 1,000 women leaders by the end of year 2025.

The team swiftly hosted the Jesus film app training in May, which was done to equip them on the main tool that they are expected to use as they reach out different people with the gospel.

Just after the training, there were numerous testimonies of participants implementing that which they had learnt from the training which included Jesus film showings, starting small groups and sharing of the

gospel using JF resources like the Wifi box.

Acknowledging the weight of the mandate, the WM team noticed how vital dedicated prayers should be made for the project so, they divided the team into the four regions and encouraged each region to host regional prayers.

Not only that, they also added the women they reach into a WhatsApp group where the culture of prayer, devote Bible study and sharing testimonies is encouraged. They also have a prayer call at 04:00 AM on Wednesdays.

There has been a tremendous consistency since its inception in June 2024. The regional

prayers started with the Hhohho region which had 2 sessions held at CCC offices on April 27th 2024 and June 17th 2024.

The next regional prayer was at the Manzini on July 22nd 2024. It was held at Conference of Churches hall where 45 women from different churches and communities in the region attended.

Lubombo region hosted an all night prayer at Ndangu on 6th September 6th 2024. 48 women attended.

As the initiative progress, WM pleas for support from individuals, churches and communities.

A MONTH OF PRAYER & FASTING

Women Ministry dedicated the whole month of September to prayer and fasting. Everyday was designated to a group of women who lead prayers and shared what they were learning from the LORD in the Women Initiative Whatsapp group which has around 70 members so far. At least 48 women

were leading in different days of the week. Time was also allocated for dedicated prayers to make sure that every hour someone was praying for the initiative.

The target is to raise 1000 women leaders by 2025



FAITHFUL GOD

Mrs. Thembi Mdluli testified on how God answered her prayers when her graduate child got a job after staying at home for some time.

On another note, she also narrated how her daughter was admitted at a South African hospital for an illness. She submitted her prayer request in the month of prayer and fasting, and her daughter has fully recovered.

One ordinary day, Nomsa Dlamini, a staff member of WM was doing street evangelism when she met Sibusiso. A young man in his early 30s who was grappling with life's challenges.

The message communicated from the 4 Spiritual led him and his friend to Christ as they paused and listened at their construction site. They both gave their lives to Christ.

As new believers, Sibusiso and his friend began attending Nomsa's prayer group sessions. During these meetings, she introduced them to the Jesus Film app, a powerful tool that made the message of Christ come alive. Along with the app, Nomsa gifted Sibusiso a Bible, setting him on the path to spiritual growth.

In one of the prayer meetings, Nomsa asked him the amazing

question, "What do you want Jesus to do for you?"* Sibusiso, caught by surprise but filled with hope, shared his deepest need.

He longed to obtain a heavy-duty driver's license, a ticket that could secure him a stable job in South Africa. But there was a hurdle—he didn't have the money to pursue the license. He was working odd jobs, saving every cent, but the goal seemed far off.

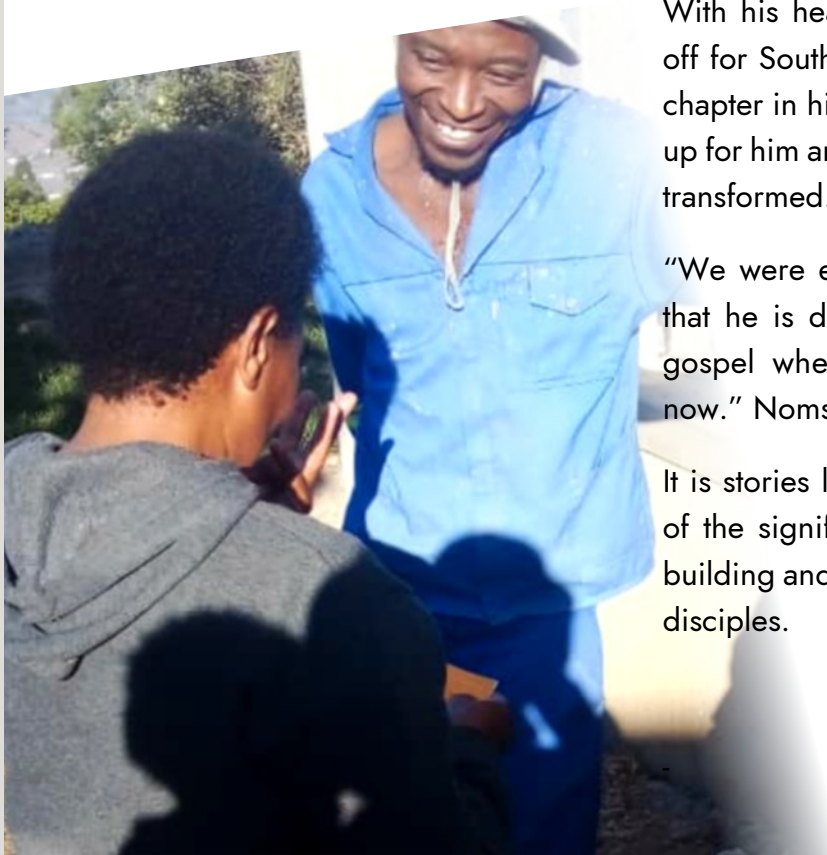

"We were excited to here him say that he is determined to share the gospel wherever he went himself now." Nomsa excitedly said.

In a concerted effort to inspire and equip Christian leaders to uphold their faith in various sectors, Leader Impact Eswatini successfully hosted two key events in mid-2024. These forums, designed to foster leadership growth and practical faith application in the workplace and home, were a source of encouragement and insight for attendees.

The first event, a **Leadership Forum**, took place on July 22, 2024, at Emafini in Ezulwini. Themed "Integrity in the Workplace," the forum featured High Court Judge Mzwandile Fakudze as the guest speaker. Judge Fakudze shared how Christians are called to uphold their integrity, particularly in challenging work environments. His message resonated with the audience, as he emphasized that integrity should remain a cornerstone of professional conduct, even when faced with moral and ethical dilemmas. "It's not easy, but as Christians, we are mandated to hold fast to our values," Fakudze said, reminding attendees of their higher calling.

On September 2, 2024, Leader Impact followed up with a **Business Forum and Financial Literacy Plus Family Life Seminar**, which took place at the same venue. This event drew entrepreneurs, business leaders, and family life advocates alike Sindi Simelane, owner of Café 360 and Mug & Bean in Ezulwini, shared her personal entrepreneurial journey. She emphasized the importance of trusting God as one navigates the highs and lows of business.

Terrence Thwala, facilitating on financial literacy cautioned against the pressure of competition, terming it the "Grade 1 issue," which drives many to make reckless financial decisions. Thwala emphasized that financial management is not tied to income size but to the discipline of responsible spending.

Elon Kateweho, Africa Family Life director added to the impactful session with a vision casting on Family Life. He challenged Eswatini to adopt Christ-centered strategy for family well-being. Kateweho's message stressed the need for families to live intentionally in alignment with biblical principles, offering practical guidance for healthier, faith-driven homes.

The two events were not just opportunities for growth in leadership, business, and family life—they were a powerful reminder that Christ is at the center of everything. Through integrity, wise stewardship of our resources, and Christ-centered family living, we can be a testimony of God's love and purpose.
