## DMDP BLITZ FOR NEW STAFF

When we reopened for the 2026 ministry year, the ministry had the privilege of strengthening staff capacity through Discipleship Ministry Partner Development (DMPD) training facilitated by global ministry partner development leaders Jacob and Idah Banda.

This strategic training was designed to equip staff with the necessary tools, mindset, and practical skills to raise ministry partners who will support the mission of reaching people with the Gospel. A total of 18 staff members participated in the training; 12 new Staff and 6 coaches. The presence of both trainees and coaches created a learning environment where new staff could receive encouragement, guidance, and accountability as they began their ministry partner development journey.

The DMPD Blitz came at the right time. Prior to this training, staff had received MPD orientation in November and had already begun raising support. However, the DMPD Blitz provided a more comprehensive and practical framework, equipping staff with deeper understanding and proven strategies for effective ministry partner development.

Throughout February and March 2026, all ministry staff has devoted themselves fully to applying the principles learned during the training.

This commitment will significantly enable many people to join the mission team and play a part in helping to fulfil the Great Commission even with their finances and prayers wherever they are.

The DMPD Blitz has significant impact on the staff, particularly among the new staff who had just begun their support-raising journey. Many of them initially lacked experience, structure, and sufficient support in raising ministry partners. Through the training, they have gained practical skills such as setting appointments, tracking progress, and confidently sharing the vision of the ministry with potential partners.

Equally important has been the transformation in mindset. Previously, support raising was often viewed as simply asking people for money. The training helped staff understand that DMPD is a ministry partnership—inviting others to participate in the work God is doing through the Great Commission. This shift has increased faith, confidence, and motivation among the staff.

The training has also strengthened accountability and teamwork as staff attend the appointments, and in prayer and encouragement. Overall, the DMPD Blitz has laid a strong foundation for a healthier support-raising culture within Cru Eswatini.

Speaking about the Blitz, LDHR King Kunene had this to say,

## SUPPORTING MISSIONS

In one major highlight, Nkululeko Ndzimandze who is part of the new staff challenged Pastor Sibandze from Mbabane Alliance Church who was so moved by the Campus Crusade for Christ' vision and committed to support at a person capacity and then donated SZL 10,000 for the national ministry.

Taking the initiative to challenge him did not only help Nkululeko but helped the national ministry and another organization as the church then committed to also give the same amount to Scripture Union which also focus on the Great Commission.

Nelisiwe Zulu also met a potential partner who was excited to finally meet someone from Campus Crusade and cited that He had vowed in his heart to help renovate the lighting facilities at the conference hall. He said that he had been emailing to the national ministry but would not receive any feedback on the intent.

These stories are a constant reminder that God prepares His people to finance the mission, They are also an assurance that being obedient in having appointments opens doors to bless not only one's ministry but others as well.

## NOT A FAN

### *Students Day Camp*

In January 2026, the Student-Led Movement (SLM) team partnered with missionaries from Campus Crusade for Christ Korea, who stayed in Eswatini for a week to support evangelism and discipleship efforts on campus. This partnership culminated in a focused Evangelism Week, during which teams actively engaged students at Eswatini College of Technology (ECOT) and Eswatini Medical Christian University (EMCU).

At the conclusion of the evangelism week, students were invited to attend a one-day “NOT A FAN” Camp, designed to challenge them to move beyond simply admiring Christ and to step fully into authentic discipleship.

Over 150 students from five universities

across the country gathered for the camp, including: Eswatini College of Technology (ECOT), Eswatini Medical Christian University (EMCU), Limkokwing University, Botho University, and Southern African Nazarene University (SANU)

Students from ECOT and EMCU were joined by disciples invited from other campuses, reflecting the growing reach of the SLM movement nationwide.

The camp was marked by powerful worship, engaging games, meaningful teaching, food and fellowship, and deep moments of prayer as students interceded for Eswatini—particularly for the spiritual awakening of young people across the nation.

Students were intentionally challenged to embrace the call of discipleship and the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19–20). One of the most powerful moments of the day was the commissioning of students to go and preach the Gospel, stepping forward in faith with boldness and conviction.

Participants testified of real transformation, renewed commitment to Christ, and clarity of purpose. There was a strong sense that God is at work in Eswatini—raising a generation that will carry the Gospel to Europe, Asia, and other African nations.

In addition, students experienced elements of Korean culture, adding a meaningful cross-cultural dimension that strengthened a sense of global Christian fellowship.

### Ongoing Campus Discipleship

Following the camp, SLM continues to sustain discipleship across campuses. Currently:

Seven small groups are in place, though discipleship momentum has slowed in some. Active campuses include SANU, ECOT, and EMCU.

Special appreciation is extended to the volunteers at EMCU, whose consistency—especially during Tuesday gatherings—has made a significant on-the-ground impact.

Encouragingly, alumni and former students who were discipled through SLM are now stepping up to share the Gospel and lead discipleship efforts, with many leading small groups themselves. This multiplication

of discipleship has been particularly impactful during a season when staff are focused on raising support for ministry sustainability and salaries.

“Seeing former students now leading others reminds us why we do this work. The fruit of discipleship continues to multiply.” Emphasized Mancoba Dlamini the SLM Eswatini leader.

The NOT A FAN Camp and ongoing campus engagement stand as a testimony to God’s faithfulness—marked by transformation, unity, joy, and purpose. What began as a week of evangelism has continued to bear fruit through empowered students, committed volunteers, and multiplying leaders.

# IDM

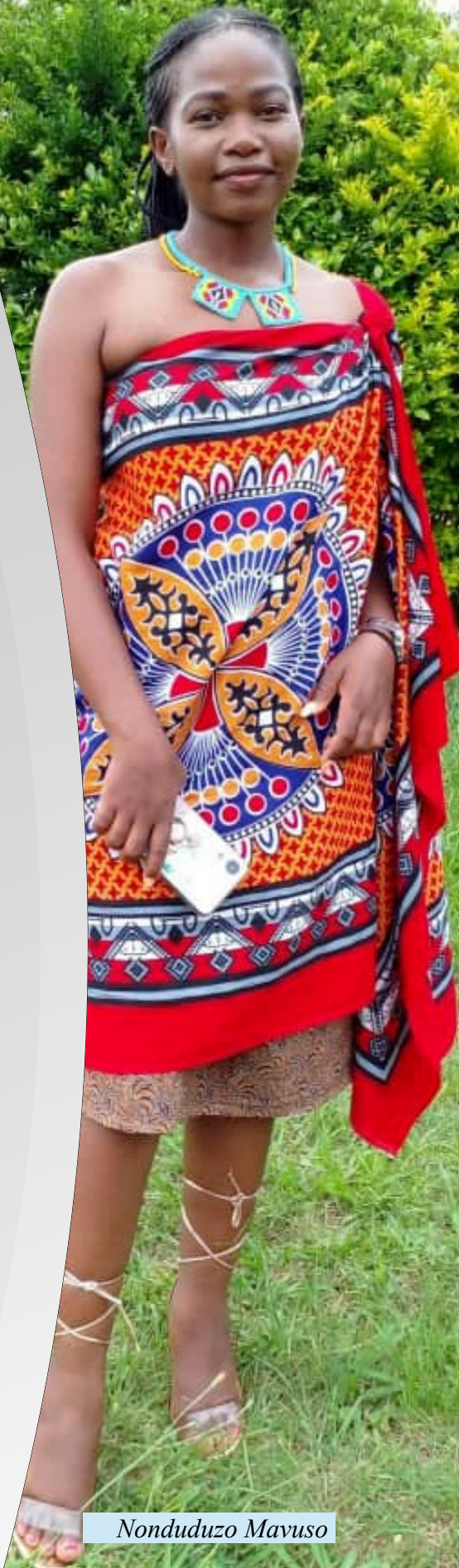
## TRANSFORMED

## PASTORS MISSIONS AND LEADERS CONFERENCE

In December 2025, Global Church Movements (GCM) Eswatini hosted an impactful Pastors Missions and Leaders Conference from 9–11 December at Metropolitan Evangelical Church, Manzini. The conference brought together pastors, church planters, missions leaders, and Christian organization representatives with the aim of strengthening collaboration, leadership capacity, and readiness for the harvest.

The conference was facilitated by Dr. Tariku Fafu, GCM Africa Director and author of *Ethical and Holistic Leadership*. His visit was a significant blessing to the nation. Through biblically grounded teaching, Dr. Tariku equipped pastors and leaders on holistic and ethical leadership, addressing the need for integrity, balance, and character in ministry and leadership contexts. Each participant received a copy of his book, further reinforcing the teachings beyond the conference sessions. 106 people in total attended the conference.

A major milestone emerging from the conference was the successful launch of GACX Eswatini, an alliance of Christian organizations committed to collaboration and church planting. GCM Eswatini is grateful to be one of the 13 founding organizations within this alliance. This platform presents a strategic opportunity to share resources, align efforts, and strengthen church-planting initiatives across communities in Eswatini.

As a result of the conference, 23 churches requested GCM to assist in evangelism and discipleship trainings which presented a vital opportunity for GCM Eswatini to expand partnerships and strengthen church-based movements nationwide.

The conference refuelling of leaders, it challenged them not only to lead others but to also significantly excel in personal leadership. Nelisiwe Zulu a GCM staff expressed this vividly when she said; "It's easy and fulfilling to equip others but this conference did the hard part, it challenged me to see if my life is holistic and ethically aligned, something that will help a lot as I serve in any capacity that God entrust me with."

Pastor Thulani Dube of Kingdom of Grace Church expressed a strong desire to be trained in preparing for the harvest, with the goal of equipping other believers across the country. Many more leaders expressed the same interest from the feedback sheet as 29 respondents asked for continuous training and mentorship from the GCM team.

As GCM thrive in equipping believers for evangelism and discipleship, this conference strengthened the relationship it has with different churches and organizations.

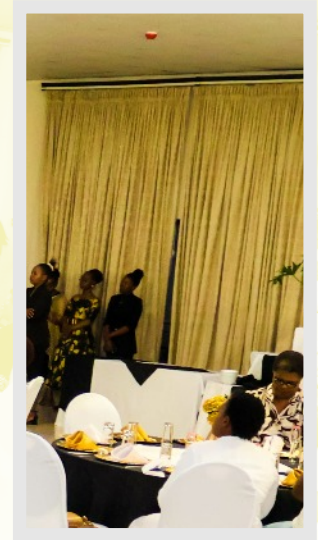

## VISION CASTINGS FOR UPCOMING ABPWL IGNITE

This landmark gathering is expected to bring influential women leaders from across the continent to advance faith driven leaders, marketplace discipleship, for the fulfilment of the Great Commission.

As a pathway towards the main event, the organizing team has been intentionally mobilizing and inviting different women leaders through vision castings conducted across key cities and regions of the country.

The reception has been overwhelmingly positive, with strong leadership, immediate registrations, and visible ownership of the vision.

Mr. Naton Kamanga, Africa Leader Strategies Director clearly unpacked what L.I.F.E partnership means, which was excitedly received by most of the attendees.

Apart from the Manzini vision casting, there were also vision castings in Siteki for the Lubombo region and Hlathi for the Shiselweni region. Siteki Municipal City Council CEO Sithembile Simelane was very instrumental to organize the Lubombo based business women. On the day 13 leaders attended and committed to invite others for the main event.

Following the Siteki gathering, an additional vision casting was held in Hlathikhulu, where the response was positive also. A swazi born business leader based in Germany expressed strong alignment with the Ignite vision and committed, God willing, to sponsor at least three participants for the August 2026 conference, while also mobilizing women leaders within her international networks.

## SUCCESS AT SCHOOL SEMINARS

The Women Ministry team visited several schools in March 2026 to conduct Success At School seminars, reaching learners with practical guidance and the message of hope. The schools included SAIM Christian High School, Lobamba National High School, John Wesley High School, and Boyane High School.

At SAIM Christian High School, 120 students attended the seminar, and 93 made decisions to receive Christ. At Boyane High School, 105 students participated, with 90 responding to the Gospel. This marked the second time the seminar was hosted at the school since 2024. This year, three grades were reached and equipped.

At Lobamba National High School, students were trained alongside their

parents, creating a unique opportunity to address both groups. The topics were carefully tailored to meet the needs of each audience, encouraging both academic growth and spiritual development.

John Wesley High School continues to build a strong partnership with Campus Crusade for Christ, having hosted the seminar for the second time. This year, three grades were reached, with a total of 249 students attending. Out of these, 193 made decisions to receive Christ.

As the Success At School seminars continue to expand across different schools, we trust God for lasting transformation in the lives of students, families, and communities.

## EQUIPPED TO SET CAREER GOALS

When the Women Ministry team visited John Wesley High School for the *Success at School* seminar this year, the expectation was the same; to facilitate the different topics, share the gospel, and connect with students who need help.

But for Andile Mathabela, a Form 5 student, it became more than just another session. It became a moment to appreciate the impact that the *Success at School* program had in his life.

With a bewildered face, he patiently waited for a moment to speak to Mrs. Thuli Kaledi, who had taught *Setting Goals* the previous year. He had approached her back then to ask what he should do if he wanted to study abroad. Kaledi had advised him to start planning that very year, to actively look for scholarships, and to continue studying earnestly.

He listened.

“I have exciting news to share, ma’am. Last year I asked for advice on how to study abroad,” he said.

“Oh, I remember,” Kaledi responded.

“I have already secured the scholarship, and now I only need to make sure that I pass my exams. I will be going to study in the University of Botswana. Thank you so much for the advice,” he shared.

It was a simple moment, but a powerful one.

What was shared in a brief conversation the previous year had now produced tangible results. Andile did not just receive advice—he acted on it.

His story became a reminder of the true impact of the *Success at School* program; that beyond the presentations and sessions, it is the personal engagements, the questions asked, and the steps taken afterwards that truly shape lives.

# A MULTIPLYING VISION THROUGH DISCIPLESHIP

After attending the AIA InSports Training in Kenya in March 2025, Manqoba Dlamini returned to Eswatini with a renewed passion—to see the Gospel intentionally and vigorously shared through sport. But this vision would not be fulfilled alone.

Manqoba's discipleship journey had already begun in 2023, when he met Thapelo Khumalo who was serving as an administrator at Sigangeni Junior's Football League. What started as a simple connection gradually grew into a purposeful relationship grounded in faith, mentorship, and growth.

Recognizing his potential, Manqoba invested in Thapelo, walking closely with him in discipleship. This investment deepened when Manqoba took Thapelo along to the Ultimate Training Camp in Zimbabwe—an experience that would further shape his understanding of ministry and calling.

Today, Thapelo is part of Manqoba's discipleship group and has become an active volunteer within the AIA ministry in Eswatini, a movement still in its early stages. Despite its infancy, the seeds of impact are already visible.

Thapelo has embraced the call not only to grow, but to multiply. He is now intentionally discipling others, including Thabiso Ngwenya, who is also actively involved in sports ministry within his community. Through this, the vision that began with one is now reaching many.

What makes this story powerful is not just participation—but reproduction. A young man once being disciplined is now discipling others. A movement once small is now beginning to take root. And in Eswatini, it is only just beginning.

## A LIFE THAT MULTIPLIES

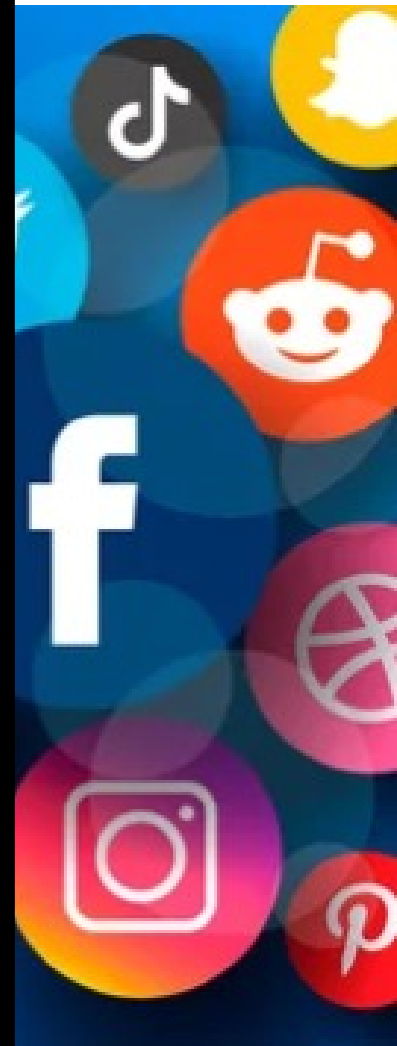
Lindokuhle Mkhwanazi, a Nursing graduate from Southern African Nazarene University, has a story that goes far beyond academics. Her journey with Campus Crusade for Christ began in high school when she met Luvuyo Dube. While the seed was planted then, it was during university that she became intentional about sharing the Gospel.

Through discipleship training, Lindokuhle didn't just learn—she caught the vision. Making disciples became personal and practical in her everyday life. After graduating, she stepped forward in faith. She now leads a discipleship group of about eight people, made up of students and young professionals, meeting weekly for fellowship, prayer, and sharing the Gospel.

Beyond physical meetings, she keeps the group connected through a WhatsApp platform where members share testimonies and encourage one another. The group lives out a culture of Prayer, Care, and Share—fostering growth, accountability, and mission.

Recently, Lindokuhle challenged each member to invite one new person as a step toward multiplication. Every member responded, and the group began to grow—not by pressure, but through obedience and love for Christ.

Reflecting on her journey, she shares: “I love the discipleship group because it’s a way of growth for me and fellowship with these young people who are so eager to share Christ with everyone.”
